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**THINGS YOU CAN'T MISS!**

**Lookout Tres Cruces**  
 In the southernmost point of the Park, you'll find spectacular views of the Andes and the rising sun across the Amazonian Horizon.

**Juarez, Otorongo and Salvador Lakes**  
 Three Lakes (Cochas in Quechua) perfect for viewing wildlife, with hikes of varying degrees of difficulty.

**Nature Destination**  
 In Manu, you will be able to explore the Amazonian Rainforest in canoe or on foot, and enjoy the sights of tremendous trees, beautiful orchids, snakes, deer, jungle rodents, and the vibrant plumage of the cock of the rock.

**Indigenous Community**  
 In Manu and its buffer zone, you can find a diverse group of indigenous communities including the Matsigenka, Yine, Harakmbut, among others.



Recognized as a Biosphere Reserve and a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, Manu is one of the most biodiverse places on the planet. The Park itself protects a huge variety of ecosystems, from the plains of the High Andes to the Dense Amazonian Rainforests, to the lush cloud forests found in between. Manu's pristine rivers, lagoons, and tropical forests are ideal for seeing all types of wildlife, from the vibrant cock of the rock to the curious Giant River Otters to the illustrious Jaguar. A trip without equal to the heart of the Peruvian Jungle to see close up its natural treasures and its distinct cultural practices of peoples that live in perfect harmony with the untamable Amazon Jungle.





**Juarez, Salvador, and Otorongo Lake**

These three lakes are located on the Manu River and contain basic lodging along with many kilometers of trails. They are perfect for viewing Giant River Otters.

**Recommendations for having an unforgettable experience in Manu:**

- ▶ Respect the instructions given by the Park Rangers; they are there to help you.
- ▶ Follow only the signposted routes and paths; this will protect the habit of the flora and fauna.
- ▶ Do not pick up or move plants from the natural habitat, every organism is important to their habitat.
- ▶ Maintain the paths clean, and take care of the signs and constructs within the Reserve.
- ▶ Please leave pets at home; they can disturb wildlife, and spread diseases.
- ▶ All adventure activities must be done through Park authorized tour operators.

**The Pusharo Hieroglyphics**  
 Located on the Banks of the Palotia River, these hieroglyphics include diverse figures engraved a rock wall. Testimony of the pre-colonial occupation of the region.



**Indigenous Communities**  
 In the Buffer Zone of Manu, you will find a variety of ethnically diverse indigenous communities, like the Shipetari, Palotia-Tepero and Diamante that can be visited.



**Tres Cruces**  
 Found at the southernmost point of the National Park, at an elevation of 3,600 meters, this lookout offers incredible views, on one side, the steep Andean mountain range, and on the other side, the endless canopy of the Amazon Rainforest. If you find yourself here between the months of May and August, the sunrise at Tres Cruces is a must see.
