Indigenous Communities

Pacaya Samiria is one the most biodiverse areas on the planet. In its forests and rivers, there are more than a thousand registered species of vertebrates.

THINGS YOU CAN'T MISS!

Known as the Forests of Mirrors, by the intensity with which the black waters reflect the forest, the National Reserve Pacaya-Samiria protects within its immense territory, one of the most incredible ecosystems on the planet: The Flooded Forests of the Amazon. An aquatic world formed by an intricate system of rivers and lakes, where creatures like the Pink River Dolphin, the Black Caiman, the Yellow Spotted River Turtles, and enormous flocks of cormorants flourish. Located close to the City of Iquitos, Pacaya Samiria constitutes the heart of the Peruvian Jungle.

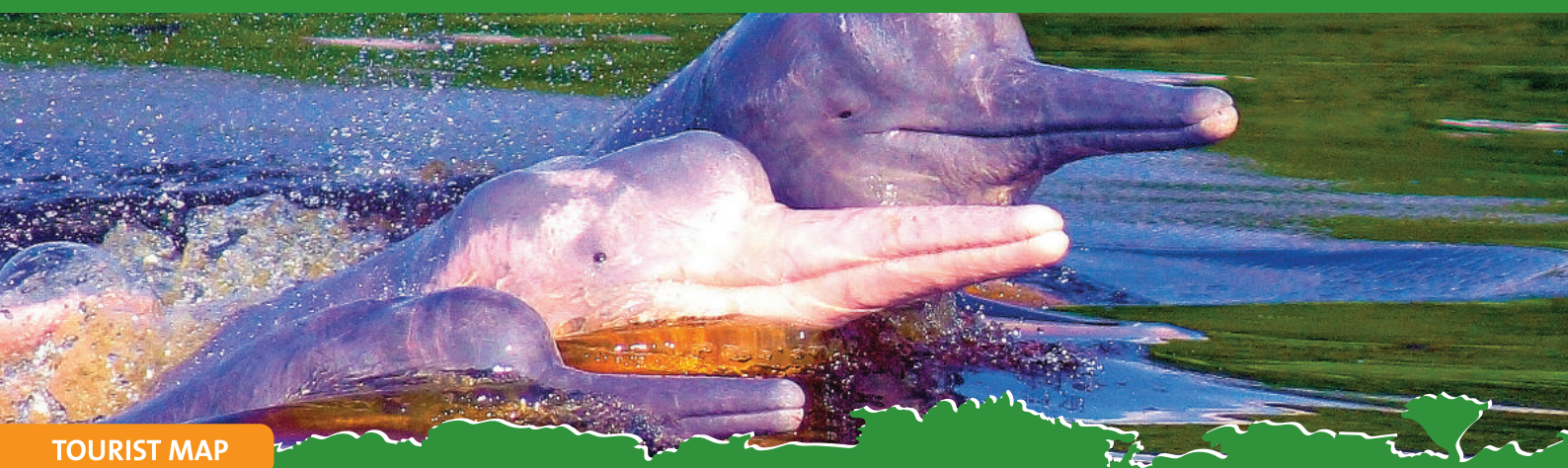

Recommendations for having an unforgettable experience in Pacaya Samiria:

- ▶ Respect the instructions given by the Park Rangers; they are there to help you.
- ▶ Follow only the signposted routes and paths; this will protect the habit of the flora and fauna.
- ▶ Do not pick up or move plants from the natural habitat, every organism is important to their habitat.
- ▶ Maintain the paths clean, and take care of the signs and constructs within the Reserve.
- ▶ Do not disturb the animals when they are in the process of eating, nesting, spawning, or moving.
- ▶ Please leave pets at home; they can disturb wildlife, and can spread diseases.
- ▶ All adventure activities must be done through Park authorized tour operators.



Bajo Pacaya Sector
Is the Access point to visit the Pacaya River Basin and its flooded forests. Visit the various lakes (Sapote, Yarina, Shahuinto, Tamara) and their surrounding forests of palm trees to observe Macaws, Caiman, and Monkeys.



Samiria River
Enter through the sector San Martín de Tipishca, on the river Marañón until Nauta. The kukuma Community have in place many trails and tourism services for visitors. The basin contains a variety of lagoons, like Yarina, Shirui, and Ungurahui.



Veinte de Enero Sector
Is the entrance most frequently used to reach the Reserve and permits visitors to pass through the Yanayacu River Basin. Visit the Yarina Community and its surroundings where its many streams and creeks are great for viewing wildlife.

Iquitos-Nauta

Tibilo-Pastococha
Enter through a cluster of lagoons and the Community Santa Rosa de Tibilo. This sector is perfect for adventure tourism, and direct contact with Nature.



Victoria Sector
Enter this sector through the Puinahua Canal, an arm of the Ucayali River. Venture into the the Punga Lakes to view its great diversity of birds.



El Dorado Lake
A beautiful lagoon situated at the entrance of the Yanayacu-Pucate River Basin. Here, the members of the community Manco Cápac are involved in various conservation efforts and sustainable management of species like Paiche, Arahuaña, and Taricaya. It's also one of the best places to view birds and see the Pink River Dolphins.
